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SECOND EU SUPPORTED PROJECT TAKES OFF

In what would be termed as a shot in the arm, the European Union has awarded FVTRS a 3-year project on Vocational Education Training to be carried out among the marginalized thus enabling it to open its Regional Offices at Dimapur, Jodhpur and Hyderabad to work in the adjoining Backward Region Grant Fund Districts being identified by Government of India. The project has been started from 1st January 2010 and nine personnel are appointed to work exclusively for the proposed intensive interventions based at the regions and at Bangalore. The project while strengthen tie-ups with new stakeholders and service providers in these regions, will also involve in funding support to identified credible NGOs to carry out 60 Vocational Training projects in 12 States.

- **Title:** Vocational Education and Training for Vulnerable and Marginalized Groups in India
- **Duration:** 36 months (January 2010-December 2012)
- Project Area: 12 States

Objective: The project focused on strengthening of quality Vocational Education Training (VET) in the BRGF districts for the underprivileged school dropout and illiterate youth of the selected States and to contribute to livelihood promotion, mainly in the informal sector, for excluded communities. It also caters the need of awareness creation among different stakeholders (government, private and NGOs) about the relevance of VET and the need for its promotion in the current skill mismatch in the country for sustainable development of the unorganised sector and sensitising the stakeholders on the need for maximum allocation of resources for VET.

Estimated Results of the 3-Year Project:

• 60 partners in 3 regions have synergised to a uniform strategic approach to VET

- Underprivileged youth are counseled on VET
- Increased livelihood opportunities are created for at least 6000 underprivileged youth with a focus on proliferation of more entrepreneurs
- Increased awareness among different stakeholders on VET
- More linkages established for VET and marketing with MFIs
- Replicable VET models are created

TRAINING-OF-TRAINERS (TOT) ON ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT (EDP)

A six-day Training-of-Trainers' on Entrepreneurship Development (EDP) has been structured for project co-ordinators of partner organizations to provide a thorough understanding of EDP, an essential prerequisite for skill training courses. Mr N Ramesh, Associate Senior Faculty of Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India, Bangalore was identified as resource person.

Two, T-o-Ts were held on 4-10 January at Bhubaneswar, Orissa and on 22-27 February at Siliguri, West Bengal where 44 project co-ordinators from the States of Orissa, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, Jharkhand, Bihar and Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Assam, Tripura and Mizoram participated. Study materials were provided to participants and certificates issued on completion of the training. Dr P Basak, Board member of FVTRS made a presentation on Interpersonal Skills and Generic Skills' on the last day of the course. Mr Roshan Rai Board member of FVTRS from Darjeeling facilitated the programme at Siliguri.

REGIONAL PROMOTIONAL CONSULTATIONS

FVTRS is organising Regional Promotional Consultations from time to time to fasten up the pace of skill training in the country by sensitizing and roping in new service providers to work among underprivileged school dropout and illiterate youth who live in distant interior places. The occasion is also used to verbalise on critical gaps in the VET scenario and to bring in more consciousness on the plight of the unorganized sector with highlights on the role of MES and various MFIs in the micro-finance field to be of assistance to budding entrepreneurs. Four such oneday consultations were organised at Kolhapur in Maharashtra, Dharwad in Karnataka, Vijayawada in AP and at Agra-UP in the quarter.

KOLHAPUR CONSULTATION

In collaboration with Ashankur Charitable Trust a one-day Promotional Consultation was organised at Kolhapur, Maharashtra on 20 January. 68 participants from government, NGOs, academia, and civil society attended. Dr P Basak, FVTRS Board member delivered the key-note address on unorganised sector and the relevance of skill training.

Mr Milind Tonape, District Social Welfare Officer, Kolhapur inaugurated the programme. Mr Felix D'Souza, Programme Manager, FVTRS facilitated a session on funding procedures and processes of FVTRS and relevance of skill training in the present scenario of the country.

DHARWAD CONSULTATION

A one-day Promotional Consultation on 'Prospects of Skills Training in the Unorganised Sector' was organised in collaboration with Belgaum Diocesan Social Service Society at Dharwad on 2 February. 50 NGO representatives from Northern Karnataka attended. Mr Chandrakanth Bellad, MLA, Dharwad; Mr Dindalkoppa, Project Director, DRDA and Mr Shashi Mohan from CAPART, Dharwad were guests of honour on the occasion. AGRA CONSULTATION

A consultation on 'Prospects of Skill Training in the Unorganised Sector' was conducted at Agra, Uttar Pradesh on 24 March. Archbishop Albert D'Souza inaugurated the programme. Fr Binoy, Director, Agra Catholic Diocese Social Service Society and Sr Mary P T, Director, Regional Forum were among the guests on the occasion. 42 NGO representatives participated. Mr Albert Joseph and Mr Felix D'Souza facilitated the consultation. Dr P Basak, Board member of FVTRS gave a presentation on Unorganised Sector highlighting the present conditions in the unorganised sector in India in general and Agra in particular.

STUDY AND RESEARCH

Mr Albert Joseph and Mr Felix D'Souza held discussions with Mr Jagadananda, Board member, FVTRS and Dr Saroj Maina, Research Consultant on a 'Market Survey and Study on Trades' to be organised at Bhubaneswar. Two youth camps are also being planned as part of the study in Orissa on completion of the task to capture youth perspectives on livelihood issues and on trade feasibilities.

MEETING WITH NIOS, IGNOU, MSME

Held extensive discussions with Dr S S Jena, Chairman, National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS), Noida, New Delhi and Prof G C Naidu, Director, School of Vocational Education and Training (VET) of IGNOU in January and discussed certification issues to provide visibility and upward mobility to trainees. This was followed by another round of discussions in March along with Dr P Basak, Board member of FVTRS where areas of cooperation are identified. MoU are being prepared for possible collaboration with these institutions.

Dr P Basak, Board Member of FVTRS, Mr Albert Joseph and Mr Felix D'Souza visited NIOS on 23 March to seek possible collaboration. Discussions were held with Dr S S Jena, Chairman and officials of NIOS on certification of trained youth in various trades in an effort to facilitate vertical growth linking the trainees also to complete higher secondary schooling. As mandated FVTRS has sent a detailed proposal mentioning trades, curricula and partner network link to NIOS. In act of solidarity, Dr Jena has agreed to organise all New Delhi based consultations/conferences of FVTRS at NIOS premises on Vocational Education and Training.

Also held a meeting with Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) New Delhi on 25 March. Possibility to send proposals under RGUMY (Rajiv Gandhi Udayami Mitra Yojana) and EDI proposal to train youth in EDP and skills training were discussed in detail with Mr S K Goyal, Director, MSME, Government of India. FVTRS was asked to send proposal and also to encourage skill training project partners to send proposal directly to MSME for organising EDP training.

Visited also Prof G C Naidu, Director, School of VET and Dr RSP Singh of IGNOU and other staff to further strengthen collaboration specifically for certification for trained youth together with IGNOU. The detail proposal has been sent to IGNOU to further take up the matter in the forthcoming meeting that IGNOU will organise in April/May.

GOVERNING BOARD MEETING

A Governing Board meeting of FVTRS was held on 12 March 2010 at Bangalore and reviewed FVTRS activities and plans for the financial year 2010-11.

PROJECT SELCETION COMMITTEE MEETING

Project Selection Committee meeting was held along with the Governing Board meeting on 12 March. 14 project proposals were approved for a sum of Rs. 65,92,425/- for promoting skill training in different trades for 2331 youth in the States of Bihar, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Orissa, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh.

PARTNERS' EXPOSURE AND EXCHANGE, NAGPUR

A two-day Partners' Exchange Meet was organised at Nagpur on 9-10 March. It brought together 23 representatives (Chief Functionaries, Coordinators, Instructors) of partner organizations from the States of Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, and Uttar Pradesh.

Mr A D Ramteke, Additional Dy. Commissioner of Nagpur Municipal Corporation graced the inauguration session and emphasized upon the need of Vocational Training. A sharing session was held where participants exchanged their views on issues of trainees' retention, certification, training methods, linkage, etc.

Participants visited Church of North India Social Service Institute (CNISSI) training centre and interacted with trainees, instructors, co-ordinators which was followed by a visit to Butibori Manufacturer' Association - 40 kms away from Nagpur - and other industries around that helped participants to understand possible issues in placement, skill-set and recent employment trends prevalent in industrial arena. They also visited Sewa Gram, ashram of Mahatma Gandhi and Centre of Science for Villages, an organization running various vocational training activities in Wardha on the second day.

PROJECT MONITORING AND PRE-ASSESSMENT VISITS

Monitoring visits to four projects in Orissa and Tamil Nadu were done by Mr Felix D'Souza and Mr C P Nicholas. This apart, twelve pre-assessment visits were done in the States of Bihar, Orissa, Northern Karnataka, Kerala and Uttar Pradesh state was done by Mr Felix D'Souza and Mr C P Nicholas.

An educational tour of FVTRS staff was organised from 27 – 29 January to Goa. Team visited places of interest like St Francis Xavier' Church, St Francis of Assisi and Archeological Museum, Spice plantation garden, Aguada Fortress and beaches of Goa. The occasion was utilized to revisit, review and internalise previous capacity building exercises on Team Building, Entrepreneurship Skill Development, Communication Skills, and Management classes by a series of resource persons and experts in the past.
