Anisha a 26-year-old woman from Mihijam, Jharkhand is a highly motivated and progressing self employed woman of her area. She was a victim of child marriage and was terribly ill-treated by her in-laws. She was brought back to her home depressed and terribly shaken and stayed home for many years as she could do nothing for herself. The staff of Onkar Seva Sansthan came to know about her during their skill training mobilization programme. Understanding her situation, they have motivated her to do skill training. She required a real change from clutches of her past, so she joined for artificial jewelry making and learnt jewelry making and dry flower making as well as packing spending extra time with the trainer. She was also very much interested in the other trainings like life skill, EDP, Gender awareness, HIV/AIDS, and Girls not brides.

The training and facilitation helped her to learn a lot and by the time of her completion training, she has developed a better prospective for her life and she became an entirely different person who is an energetic and highly motivated. She enrolled herself in open schooling and completed 10th standard successfully. She could also gain knowledge on digital literacy and started making and selling artificial jewelries online and earning decent income. She is also running an artificial jewelry making training center for women and working in a govt. livelihood project **Tejeswani**, training many other vulnerable women and adolescent girls. She is earning Rs.6,000/- per month from this engagement. All this achievement helped her to grow as a person of high self-esteem.

She says, ***“I have wiped of my inferiority and pains of past and now I am a woman of self-esteem and who can stand her own.”***



Anisha facilitated many young women to partake skill training and to earn income for their development. One of such cases is that one of her close friends **Ms Nilu Soren** a tribal girl who is differently abled was motivated and facilitated to join skill training at Onkar Seva Sansthan. Understanding her feelings and life situation, Anisha decide to support

her. Anisha felt that she can understand Nilu’s situation better than anybody else as she has faced worser situation.

Anisha detailed about Nilu and her family situation. She was extremely poor and there were not any one to support her. Her father died when she Nilu with her mother and brother was a child, and her mother used to work as a maid in a house nearby. As Nilu is differently abled, and no one was there to take her to school, she could not even complete her primary education.

Anisha motivated and guided her to join for skill training as well as accompanied her throughout the training and Nilu completed the garment making training successfully. She joined in a self-help group promoted by the Jharkhand State livelihood mission and now she is the president of the group. All these developments helped Nilu to gain confidence in life. Others may wonder the way she speaks and facilitates the meetings. She took Rs.25000 loan from the group and purchased an electrical sewing machine and started a small tailoring shop in her village and earning income to support her family needs as well as for her developments.

Nilu says, ***“I want to prove the society that physical barrier is nothing to come up in life if there is someone to support like Anisha Di”***
